How do you transform an acclaimed and beloved Alfred Hitchcock movie into an exhilarating theatrical production? Well, it's not easy.

I've been directing shows for 36 years and this is the most technically intricate production I've ever attempted.

The 39 Steps has 33 scenes set in 20 locations and includes planes, trains, and automobiles. Dozens of characters are portrayed by only 4 actors. We're incorporating extraordinary stagecraft such as shadow play, projections, and puppetry to create a hyper-theatrical production. There are 100 light cues and close to 200 sound cues!

We are able to do this because Clague Playhouse has remarkable designers, crew, and actors.

Take a minute to look at the Production Staff credits. These generally unseen individuals are talented designers and volunteers who produce high quality shows. I thank them for their incredible contributions.

His home on Frank Street in North Olmsted, a short drive from Claque Playhouse, included a backyard woodworking shop and basement darkroom where he developed his own photography.
