

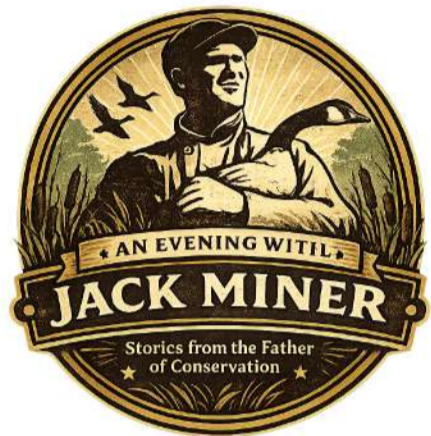
# July 3-5 Event Descriptions
